John Grube joined the Ashton Fire Department on August 4,1986. As one can imagine, John has been an incredible firefighter over his 34 years of service. We as the North Fremont Fire District were sad to see his retirement on September 30, 2020. But, we have been blessed by John's example and service and we wish him all the best!



After joining as a volunteer firefighter in 1986, John was given the opportunity to be the training officer for the Ashton Fire Department from 1988-1991. During this time, he also acquired the job of secretary from 1989-1992. At this time the Ashton Fire department started to outgrow their current building on Main Street, so was then merged into the North Fremont Fire Department that we know today. John continued being secretary for the North Fremont Fire Department from 1991-1995. In 1996, John was selected to serve as the Fire Commissioner until 2004. In 2004 until his retirement at the end of September, John served as Chief of the North Fremont Fire Department.

One of the changes that John has been a part of is the merge from the Ashton Fire Department to the North Fremont Fire District. He was also instrumental in adding the EMT's under the same roof as the fire department. In 1992 when John's pager went off his worst nightmare was coming to life. A newlywed, John answered his pager and ran to Main Street where the Ashton Hotel was on fire. This was so scary! His new bride Gina, feared for his life and John was fighting to save the other buildings on the block, for fear the entire block would be engulfed in the flames. Luckily, the North Fremont Fire District



was on scene and they were able to get the flames under control and save that block of Ashton. John has seen many firemen and trucks come and go over his years of service in the fire department. One proud moment that John is proud of happened in 2013. As fate would have it, Dubois was in dire need of a new fire truck. The one they currently

had needed a new transmission. It was enough to pump the water, but not drive to the destination. So, consequently, their fire department would have to pull the truck to the fire to put it out. Well, we were in the process of upgrading one of our trucks, and ended up leaving one there for Dubois' fire department to use. In 2018 during the Grassy Ridge fire over near Dubois our firefighters went to help fight the fire. John smiled to see that their fire department was still using the truck that our fire department had donated to them, with the label still on the truck that said North Fremont Fire Department. John's proudest moment was when the new high school was being built. He was on site throughout the project, making sure that the school's fire code was completed correctly and safely. John has always been so kind, patient, brave and dedicated. He is very community minded. When there wasn't a fire to put out, one could always see John driving the fire truck to carry Santa for the Spirit of Christmas, helping with the Homecoming parade, handing out candy at the annual Trunk or Treat, helping the Easter Bunny with his debut, or his favorite...helping with Ashton's annual 4th of July festivities. That usually included driving the truck in the parade, spraying the kids down at the park with the fire hose, passing the boot around for the fireworks fundraiser dinner, and making sure the entire city enjoyed the greatest fireworks show possible! Yes, John is an incredible person. Those who have worked closely with John know of his passion. When John would get a new idea, he would run it through you and get your okay. Then, once you and him would carry it out he would say, "Well, we ham and egged that one"! Yes, to say that John will be missed on the North Fremont Fire Department is an understatement. But, we thank you John for your many years of service and sacrifice for our community.
