#### Ashton Archives Update

The Ashton Archives will have a display at the park on July 4th that will feature the Ashton Township By-laws and several years of minutes. JoAnn Anderson helped make copies of the 1906 papers so they may be handled. Many natives are listed along with property payments. Description of the Hess Museum with pictures includes an inventory.

Small items including an Ashton star police badge found by Kristy Parkinson, a handmade baby coat, several advertising give-aways from years ago and a perfect attendance award might stir your interest! How many people will recognize a blotter? Archivist, Jane Daniels, has some revamped light fixtures to show off thanks to the city.

Margaret Howe has finished cataloging many of the photos in the Archives along with cross referencing the pictures which hopefully will make them easier to locate. Items needed to enhance the Archives include yearbooks from the early and middle 1960's, and pictures of Bear Gulch.

Due to failing health, Jane Daniels needs to retire. Jane can no longer lift the newspaper boxes. She is hoping someone who can say "no" will be found since the hardest part of being the Archivist is the ability to politely refuse your best friend when they want to borrow something from the Archives.
