Grossmami's House

When Ruth Bishop started school as a child in Switzerland, she learned to knit because knitting was part of the curriculum. First she knitted a scarf, she graduated to socks, and she has never stopped knitting. Using her hands to make beauty has been a part of Ruth's life.

In 1967, Ruth and her husband were looking for property to buy. Mr. Manwaring wanted to move to Rigby and open his own cheese factory, but Mrs. Manwaring didn't want to sell the cheese factory in Ashton unless they sold their big, old house too. Ruth's husband said he wanted the Ashton cheese factory and Ruth said she wanted the big old house because it reminded her of Switzerland. Ruth already had plans for her sister, Clara Kaufman, and a local carpenter to help her remodel the house room by room.

Several years ago two of Ruth's grandson-in-laws, James Allen and James Helfrich, got together and unbeknownst to Ruth took pictures of her whole house. Ruth says, "They even took a picture of me eating my lunch. I don't know how they got the pictures without my knowing it."

The photos were tastefully woven into a book called "Grossmami's House" with each room showing special memories. One room houses the doll collection, a bedroom has a wall hanging made by Ruth's mother when she was a child, there is a knitted picture of the Bishop cabins at Mack's Inn, and a well used Chinese checker set has all of the original pieces. While Mr. Bishop was still alive, he took a stick and surprised Ruth by carving the piece into a chain.

With the passing years, every member of the family has obtained a copy of the book. Recently Ruth Bishop donated a copy of "Grossmami's House" to the Ashton Archives to be available for Archive visitors to enjoy. You won't be disappointed.
