Admission is included in the entrance fee to Mesa Falls (\$5 unless you have one of the passes.) This slice of history focuses on some of the colorful characters that settled the Warm River Area. People with ties to the area history are especially invited, as not all photos are identified. The exhibit is currently available and will remain at the visitor center until it closes at the end of the season. The visitor Center is open 9:30-5:30 daily until the end of September.
