Community reviews have energized community improvement and economic development efforts in over 40 rural Idaho communities since 2000.

Ashton Mayor Teddy Stronks said, "We want to find a way to grow and sustain our community without sacrificing the traditional identity that means so much to us."

The first phase of the community review process consists of a survey of all households in the 83420 zip code .

The survey asks residents to share their opinions on a range of topics including infrastructure and other community services, jobs, housing, and community involvement. Ashton area households will soon be receiving a survey form in the mail. All completed surveys need to be returned by November 5, 2018, to be included in the results.
