UPDATE FROM THE ASHTON VISITOR CENTER

The Ashton Visitor Center, now managed by Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation, has undergone significant upgrades to enhance visitor experience. Key improvements include the installation of ADA-compliant accessibility features, updated restrooms, new furnace and pellet stove, a fresh coat of exterior paint, and a new roof and windows for improved insulation. In addition to making the center more accessible and welcoming to all, these updates will allow the visitor center to remain open during the winter months—providing year-round access to area information and the opportunity to utilize the space for community events and programs. Construction is expected to be finished in early September, with a public celebration to follow shortly after.
